The capitol is officially closed. It still doesn't seem real, but after months of anticipation, the Kentucky capitol building is closed to the public for renovations. I have heard various estimates regarding its reopening, but what is clear is it will be several more years before we walk through its halls again. Nevertheless, the work of Capitol Commission will continue despite this change.



Before its closing, I walked through the capitol one last time. It was eerily empty and quiet. Regardless, I snapped a few photos.



Without a doubt, the closing of the capitol building is the most significant challenge to the ministry in many years. Over two hundred staff members have been relocated throughout the city. Our priority, right now, is to the staff

of the annex as well as the legislators during the interim period. We are also prioritizing prayer walking around the capitol. If you are interested, please let me know.



Although there are a few adjustments we are having to make, the ongoing work engaging the staff continues. Since the conclusion of the 2025 General Assembly, we met with and engaged as many of the staff members as possible in the annex. During September, we hosted our fifth and outreach luncheon. Serving the staff of the first floor, every one received food, gospel-rich resources, and an invitation to our weekly Bible study (see photos above). These outreaches require a lot of planning and support. I want to thank everyone who has donated time and resources to make them possible.



Most exciting is another baptism. For the third time in the last 18 months, we have gotten to stir the water of baptism. Josh has faithfully attended both our staff Bible study and worship. Both he and his son were recently baptized at the church I pastor. This is, without a doubt, the best part of ministry and I am grateful for what the Lord has been doing.



Unfortunately, September was dominated nationally by violence, death, and hate. Nevertheless, I am grateful for the response of the people of God to

cry out to him who has conquered the grave. Believers from around the capital city recently gathered at Buck Run Baptist Church (a longtime supporter of the ministry) to pray for our community and country. I was blessed to play a small role in the service praying for our elected leaders. It is my hope and prayer that such a clear movement of God continues spurring repentance and revival. Our nation certainly needs it.
